




### Immigrants and Norwegian-born to immigrant parents, by country background. 1970-2013




## Foreign born by country of birth 2000




### Largest country groups 2013



#### Children of immigrants, 2015








#### Childen of immigrants aged 16-34. 4th q 2013




### Labour market participation 4th q 2011





# Pct 'active' – employed or in education – age 16-34. 4th q 2013






